# 5 Social Norms that contribute to a culture of Sexual Violence

- Women: Limited roles for and objectification and oppression of women
- Power: Value placed on claiming and maintaining power (manifested as power over)
- Violence: Tolerance of aggression and attribution of blame to victims
- Masculinity: traditional constructs of manhood, including domination, control and risk-taking
- Privacy: notions of individual and family privacy that foster secrecy and silence.

# Getting at True Consent: Healthier Social Norms

- Openness, willingness to talk about sex and sexuality without judgment – Sex Positivity
- Negotiation, knowing how to communicate about what we are and are not interested in
  - •Safe Communication, learning to discuss boundaries and safety

## A History of Consent, from a Queer Eye

- Don't recreate the wheel: Learning from and crediting communities and people who have done and are already doing this work.
- Talking about sex: Where do we learn what it means to be Queer? What Queer sex looks like?
- Oppression/Homophobia/Transphobia: Deviant labels and danger lead to the need to build safety within our communities.

#### Responding to Violence: Oppressed Communities building safety

- Examining who benefits from existing power imbalances and working to create an even distribution of power
  - Rape Culture
  - Culture of Violence
  - How does this "culture" affect marginalized communities?

#### Where do we go from here? Connect, Collaborate & Credit

**Connect**: Meet the Queer and Trans folk in your community. Develop relationships. Attend events. Be seen in the community. Share the work.

Collaborate: Incorporate LGBPTQ communities' sex positivity, negotiation, safety and consent work into social norms change efforts in current primary prevention work. Engage with Queer and Trans communities as you create new prevention strategies.

Credit: Credit experts from "outside" of the anti-sexual violence movement for their leadership and contributions. Remember the ways that marginalized communities' work is often co-opted by mainstream movements. Avoid doing this.
