Pre-screening Questions for Caregiver

Follow-up questions for Intake or pre-assigned Advocate to ask caregiver if ANY accommodations are suspected as necessary.

- 1. Describe your child's disability? What kind of services does she receive at school or at home?
- 2. Tell me what level your child functions at? (what age and/or grade level)
- 3. Does your child need support with daily activities, such as eating and/or toileting? If so, please explain.
- 4. Does your child have any difficulty communicating? If yes, what do I need to know to communicate with your child?
- 5. Are there ways that they communicate other than words?
- 6. Does he/she use any special device or equipment to communicate and/or get around?
- 7. How does your child handle stressful situations? Does he act out? Tantrum? Get quiet and withdraw?
- 8. Is your child sensitive to noises, sounds, lighting, smells or textures?
- 9. What types of things are soothing to your child? What helps them calm down?
- 10. What are your child's favorite activities/objects? (*They can bring a favorite stuffed animal, blanket with them if it helps them self soothe*)
- 11. Is there any actions, behaviors or routines that your child does that we need to be aware of?
- 12. About how long do you think your child be able to stay focused during his/her appointment?
- 13. Does your child take any medications? What are they for? When do medications begin to wear off?
- 14. What is the best time of the day for your child to have an appointment? Does your child take regular naps?
- 15. Is there a teacher, therapist or other person we can contact to get more information about how to best communicate with your child during the interview?
