Things to consider when creating movement art:

- Build relationships over transactions
- Be ready to "receive feedback, shift course, be accountable, and challenge [your] own biases." Micah Bazant
- Be collaborative and cooperative
- Show the world that is possible!
- Who is your audience?
 - Focus on your shared values
 - Point them towards positive solutions
- What is your goal? What do you want the viewer to do?
 - Join your group? Come to a meeting? An Event?
 - Learn something new about an issue? Become aware of an issue?
 - Take action in some way?
 - Feel connected to a community, an issue, a solution?



Organizing Strategies that center Art:

- Art builds for protests and actions
- Accessible political education resources
- Social Media campaigns
- Public Art that shifts narratives and public discourse (murals, guerilla theater, signs)
